Job Summary

The field officer will assist the Programmes Coordinator at CCG. S/He will be in charge of the implementation of the project activities in the northern part of the country with support from the NSO Manager. S/He will be in charge of planning for meetings and programmes in the North and also keeping good records of project documents. Reports on activities will be prepared and disseminated. Ensure that administrative and monitoring activities of the project done.
